Objectives of the National Operations Room

The National Operations Room works on coordinating efforts in order to accomplish the following goals:

First Objective: Control the spread of the virus through the application of precautionary measures, minimize direct contact among people, and increase awareness of the population and access to information.

Second Objective: Ensure the continuity of services at the national level and adopt and encourage remote working. Third Objective: Increase health sector capacity by continuously assessing available resources, gaps and look for funding and technical assistance to build up capacities and case management.

Measures Introduced in Dealing with the Pandemic of COVID-19

Ministry of Public Health

- Issued a <u>daily report</u> on new cases and the status of existing cases in government and private hospitals.
- Continues to equip government hospitals in aim of raising bed capacities.

Lebanese Red Cross

- 412 new suspected cases were transferred to hospitals (14 new cases)
- 729 trained paramedics (93 new)
- 520 volunteers
- 31 trained ambulance centers (2 new)

Security services (Internal Security Forces, General Security, State Security, Army, General Directorate of Civil Defense)

- The Lebanese army and other security services implemented strict measures on all Lebanese territory to ensure public mobilization.
- The army closed 104 shops, dispersed 27 public gatherings in Bekaa Akkar, Tripoli, and Beirut. The army also supported 4 municipalities in implementing precautionary measures. Two helicopters also traveled from Beirut to Cairo to return ten officers who were on a training mission in Egypt.
- General Security Forces tracked potential cases in various Lebanese regions and ensured that they're adhering to the terms of home isolation. In addition, they dispersed several gatherings and aided several municipalities in issuing several written warnings to institutions and individuals that did not adhere to the decisions of the Council of Ministers.
- ISF issued 376 of written warnings to institutions and individuals that violated the <u>decisions of the Council of</u> <u>Ministers</u>.
- The General Directorate of Civil Defense aided 23 different municipalities in making sure that the temperature of those entering and exiting the area is in the safe range. They also aided municipalities in sterilizing roads and buildings' entrances. The General Directorate of Civil Defense also ensured that citizens are adhering to the terms of home isolation and sterilized a number of public and private facilities within various Lebanese governorates.
- State Security Forces collected information from various Lebanese regions, closed 46 commercial stores because they not adhere to health standards and issued a number of warnings to companies that did not close. Ministry of Foreign Affairs
- Issued Circular No. 1601/5 on 27/3/2020 regarding the forms that Lebanese abroad need to fill in case they want to return to Lebanon.

- Shared the hot line of all Lebanese embassies and consulates its website and social media platforms and asked the diplomatic missions to ensure daily communication with Lebanese expatriates and students, to secure their needs.
- The Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Emigrants continues to communicate with other countries to ask for medical assistance on a daily basis.

Ministry of Public Works and Transport

- A cargo plane from the Emirates arrived to Beirut at 10:50 and left at 13:00.
- Beirut Port: Two ships loaded with containers and an oil ship entered he port, and one ship loaded with containers left.
- Tripoli Port: One ship arrived from Greece loaded with gasoline and diesel.
- Sidon Port: No entry or departure was recorded.
- Tire Port: No entry or departure was recorded.
- Jounieh Port: A ship arrived from Spain loaded with fuel.
- **Note:** Before allowing any ship to enter the port, the entire crew on the ship are examined by the Ministry of Public Health to ensure that there are no coronavirus cases on board.

Minsitry of Education and Higher Education

- The Minister of Education and Higher Education issued a circular specifying how the ministry will be calculating the hours of staff working in public schools during the closure period.
- The Minister of Education and Higher Education issued a circular specifying how the hours of contractors in public schools will be calculated.

Others

- The Order of Pharmacists of Lebanon issued a circular requesting pharmacist to take all preventive measures to prevent the spread of the coronavirus and to provide maximum protection for workers in the pharmaceutical sector and customers alike. Medicine distributors were also requested not to enter pharmacies, but rather to present the order at the pharmacies' entrances.
